

STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION

Everything that flows into campus stormdrains goes without any treatment into the Campus Lagoon or Pacific Ocean. Pollutants picked up by stormwater and urban runoff can cause public health problems and result in beach closures.



COMMON SOLID POLLUTANTS:

- ◇ Plastic Bags ◇ Food
- ◇ Cigarette Butts
- ◇ Packaging ◇ Flyers
- ◇ Newspaper ◇ Pet Waste

Improper disposal causes stormwater pollution.



DO'S AND DON'TS

DON'T: Leave any trash on the ground.

DO: Dispose of all waste into a trash receptacle.

DON'T: Leave animal waste on the grass or pavement.

DO: Always carry a plastic bag to pick up after your pet.

DON'T: Pour any liquids down the stormdrain.

DO: Dispose of liquids, such as old coffee, in home sinks.

DON'T: Stand by and watch someone else pollute.
