

UCSB Stormwater Management Program



As stormwater flows over sidewalks, parking lots, streets, and lawns it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, trash, and other pollutants. Anything that enters the stormdrain system is discharged untreated into the our creeks, our beaches, the Campus Lagoon, and the Pacific Ocean. Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water.

How can you help?

Always put trash and waste in a covered trash bin.

Never pour anything in a stormdrain or onto a paved surface.

Make sure your vehicle does not leak fluid.

Pick up after your pet.

Report pollution to EH&S.



What do you report?

- If you see something being dumped or poured into a stormdrain.
- If you see someone hosing down a walkway into a stormdrain.
- If you see dirty water coming from a construction area.
- If you see someone washing their car in a campus parking lot.
